Chair – President

Committee's have been asked to put in their budget for the next two years to see if we can keep within this, by 20th May.

Bill thanked Clive and Cheryl for running a fun quiz over the weekend.

He also proposed that we should continue with club zoom meetings for forceable future, a talk about George Mallery is coming up later this month, but he needs ideas for the agendas.

Bill then ran through the induction ceremony for Steve Simmons-Jacobs, who was welcomed into the club as a full member. He is recorded as the first member to be 'zoomed' into the club (is that fast tracked?) Steve looks forward to running the raffle, don't we all! He is a Forensic mechanical engineer and expert witness, so watch out everyone, get your 'event calculations' right. A round of applause followed.

Our **speaker Sandy** took over to speak about the transformation of this year's WTTW.

He outlined the decisions made in March behind the cancellation of the usual event. This led to a dramatic and mind-blowing exercise to transform the event into aa new and exciting new event. Well done to all the event team for developing this in just 24 days. The new WALK THE TEST **another** WAY was up and running by 1st May.
