1. CLUB OFFICERS' REPORTS

Secretary

Jon will advise Members of the SGM on 3 November (the next Business Meeting) and invite volunteers for the Club roles to be agreed for the next Rotary Year, commencing July 2022.

Club Treasurer

Nick referred to the deficit on Members' personal accounts, following recent Partners' events. Balances as Nick's report.

Nick also advised lower take up expected for ROR this year. Maximum of 75 attendees is likely. This will help with social distancing for more vulnerable guests. Current plan is for Go/No Go decision by end November, to send invites for the event on 12 March 2022. Support for holding the event if at all possible and request for a later decision date, if feasible.

Trust Fund Treasurer

Graham recommended the £500 recognition award to Stuart Marchant be presented. Jon will liaise with Bill initially. If not Bill, to advise Steve George for Youth/ and Stewart, Schools Database.

Club Service

Communications

Ed Holmes, for Peter Welsh, requested Committee Chairs and Members provide as much material and photos for publicity as possible.

Schools Database - Roger requested this is raised at a future Council, once proposals are developed.

Membership

Bryan advised two guests from Chandlers Ford Rotary at the meeting. James Mahaffey to attend forthcoming meetings, as guest of Ed. Shaun O'Brien wishes to re-connect as an Associate Member.

Warren Clarke is also interested in Membership. Route approaches to Bryan, to discuss possible options to help, for Membership. Later in the meeting, Clive Collier queried why new Members were no longer allocated to a Committee; as used to be the case. Bryan may wish to consider.

Fundraising

Unanimous support and increased recognition of the amount of work and breadth of roles undertaken by the existing WTTW team - and need for greater support and involvement by Members.

Nikki establishing closer links with range of groups and schools; Romsey Community Pantry, Baby Necessities, North Baddesley and Romsey Abbey Schools. INTERNATIONAL

Nursery Tables and Chairs for the School in Kisumu, Kenya

I (Gren) was hoping to bring to Club members an update on the last of the International projects that the Club is supporting this Rotary year: the provision of nursery tables and chairs for the school in Kisumu, Kenya. Unfortunately, Kenya is suffering from some the same side effects of Covid 19 as the UK, namely shortage of supplies. Specifically there is difficulty in obtaining the wood to make the tables and chairs, so no progress has been made to date.

District International Seminar

On a slightly more positive note, I attended the District International Seminar at Mountbatten School recently along with circa 60 other Rotarians. We were seated socially distantly.

There were presentations on:

Shoebboxes, India Covid Relief Project (which the Club supported), India Dialysis Project, Purple Community Fund, Shelterbox (which the Club regularly supports), Sand Dams, Global Sight Solutions, Botha School Project and there were additional Charity displays from:

Baby Baskets, Nepal Trust, Dentaid, Send a Cow, Water Survival Box, Lend with Care, End Polio Now, Peace Jam, District Rotary Shop.

As you will appreciate, many, if not all, of the projects (which were very clearly beneficial in some way to their local population) were seeking funds from Clubs so that the projects could come to fruition. There is no difficulty in identifying worthy causes to which the Club's International Funds could be donated.

Roger requested Jon to check with Steve Simmons-Jacobs, RCORT Health & Safety Officer:

Update

Steve has advised that recent guidance indicates 'Temperature is no longer considered to be effective at determining who has the infection and who hasn't.'

Steve has recommended wording be added to meeting notifications until Covid has subsided, to remind Members of circumstances when not to attend meetings - for example having a high temperature, loss of sense of smell, positive test in the last 10 days etc. We'll see if this can be included in meeting notifications going forward.

Agreed: the temperature check is no longer required for future meetings, with immediate effect.
