**1. CLUB OFFICERS' REPORTS**

Circulated in advance of the meeting, plus as follows:

**Club Treasurer and Reminiscences of Romsey**

As Gren's report: 'Over the last couple of years the Committee has not sought to include Disaster Relief funds in its budget but rather to bring deserving causes to the attention of Club members seeking their approval for a donation to that cause from uncommitted funds.'

A Club member has brought the International Committee's attention to the situation in Afghanistan which Gren summarised. On behalf of International Committee Gren recommended a donation of £500 through the Disasters Emergency Committee appeal towards the Afghanistan Disasters.

Gren proposed, Nigel seconded. All members were in favour.

Steve gave an update on two items in his report:

**'Youth Speaks** - Pleased to say Salisbury invited us to attend their Group 5 event on February 17th at Bishops Wordsworth School , Salisbury. **Tech Tournament - March 16 2022** - Organisation is progressing for this event. We are expecting teams from Mountbatten, Romsey and Test Valley schools together with 3 schools from Southampton. Steve Simmons-Jacobs is looking for commitments to resource the event on the day. Still expecting 18 teams at the moment.'

Steve Simmons-Jacobs plans to coordinate the arrangements for the event so Rotary members are able to be at Brian Stokes' funeral on the same day.

Jon asked if the challenge would be shared with members following. There will be videos taken on the day and Steve George and Steve Simmons-Jacobs will think about a way to share the task.
